Content	Scouting is all about building confidence and self-esteem learning important life skills, leadership skills, team building, outdoor adventure, education and fun ! Scouting Started in India in the year 1909, When Captain T.H. Baker established the first Scout Troop in Bangalore. Subsequently, Scout Troops were formed in Kirkee (Pune), Shimla, Madras, Jabalpur, Lonavla (Mumbai) and registered with the imperial Headquarters during 1910 and 1911. These units were open to European and Anglo-Indian Children only. The first Guide company in India was started in Jabalpur, Central India in 1911. Bharat scout and guides is a voluntary, non-political, educational movement for young people, open to all without distinction of origin race or creed in accordance with the purpose principles and methods conceived by the founder Lord Baden Powell.

**Day 1(13<sup>th</sup> February,2023)**

The camp was organized under the guidance of Mr. Shiv Kumar and Ms. Shaifali Gautam (District Organizing Commissioner, Bharat Scouts & Guides). Inaugural session of Scouts and Guides Camp started with the lamp lightening by Prof. (Dr.) Manoj Kumar Singh (Principal, MIMT),Mr. Shiv Kumar, Ms. Shaifali Gautam and other faculty members.

Prof. (Dr.) Manoj Kumar Singh addressed the participants and told them that the Scouts and Guides should always be ready to help others and think to go beyond and welcome students by best wishes. Second day camp started with flag hoisting in the college ground by Mr. Shiv Kumar & Ms. Shaifali Gautam. After flag hoisting scout and guide prayer “Daya kar dan bhakti ka” was recited. The students were given some written file work where duties of scouts, rules of scouting and basic principles were mentioned. Some fun activities were also organized for the students which were entertaining as well as educating. Students were taught knot making. They were taught different knots for tying different objects and types of ropes to be used in scouts and guides. The purpose of conducting such training camp was to make the student aware and always help others.

**Day 3 (15<sup>th</sup> February,2023)**

On third day students were divided in State wise toli members and they deputed a toli nayak for each toli. The toli members had to march in a row and follow their 'toli nayak'. They went for adventurous visit to Mihir Bhoj Park where they were taught about group activities like first aid. They learnt to make arrows to recognize the path and had lunch there.

**Day 4 (16<sup>th</sup> February,2023)**


On this day students learnt about the various knots like reef knot, fireman's chair knot, medical knot, sheep shank, fisherman knot etc. hitches and lashings in order to prepare improvised tent and flag pose and, the pioneering projects. Students were taught bandaging and slings. They got to know about tent pitching. Students geared up for the next day cultural activities and prepared for their excellent performances.
